Dear Parishioners of Holy

This Sunday, we arrive at the  
final Sunday of Ordinary  
Time.

We anticipate the new seasons  
of Advent and Christmas,  
which are now fast  
approaching, and by the end  
of this week, we will come to  
the end of this Liturgical Year.

For almost a century now, the  
Church has celebrated this  
last Sunday of the Liturgical  
Year as "The Solemnity of  
Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe".



In 1925, faced with the rise of secularism in the world, Pope Pius XI instituted this celebration to emphasize the dominion, the glory, and the kingship of Jesus Christ over all creation – a kingship that is eternal, and will not come to an end!

Each one of our readings this Sunday speaks about the glorious reign of our Lord.

The prophet Daniel says that "his kingship is one that shall never be destroyed", the author of Revelation names him "the ruler of the kings of the earth", and in our Gospel, Jesus, standing in trial before Pontius Pilate, affirms: "My kingdom is not from this world" – He has come into the world, testifying to the truths of his kingship!

Our Catholic faith, which we hold so dear, teaches us that our Risen Lord Jesus continues forever as the King of the Universe.

Although this world that we live in is torn and divided in so many ways – sin and death are present among us as inescapable realities – the rulers of this world will not have the final say.

Jesus, the true king and ruler, will return in glory. And in his final glorious reign, all things will be brought to perfection.

On this final Sunday of Ordinary Time – this last moment before the Advent Season begins – we reflect on the kingship of Jesus Christ.

How do I prepare my heart for the coming of this one true king? May all that we do, as we await his glorious arrival, be done in his holy name.

#### NEW PANDEMIC PROCEDURES
